CHIEF RABBAN



Greetings Nobles,

March is here and this marks the end of our 60 day trial period of 2021. From a Shrine standpoint so far I'm not seeing much of a difference from 2020, but I'm optimistic that things will get better once spring is here. All kidding aside, the official astronomical start of spring is in March on the Vernal Equinox on March 20. Vernal is Greek for spring and equinox means equal night, meaning the day and night are equal in length. This only happens twice a year when the sun is directly over the equator due to the axial tilt of the Earth. The ancients observed the equinox with celebrations and rituals, and built sun tracking monuments like the famous Stonehenge to indicate the exact day. Nowadays the dates of Easter and Passover are set in relation to the equinox.

The most popular holiday in March is St. Patrick's Day. Originally a day in honor of the saint who brought Christianity to Ireland, it has become a celebration of Irish culture, food and especially drink. As the saying goes "everyone is Irish on St. Patty's Day!" So you don't have to be Irish or Catholic to watch a parade, have a good time and maybe drink a green beer. Personally I'd rather have a Guinness stout or a Strongbow cider...

There are a couple of unofficial holidays in March. Mathematicians and math teachers celebrate Pi Day on March 14, since 3/14 mimics 3.14, the first three digits of the number pi. Schools tend to hold math competitions and pie eating contests, especially noting when the clock hits 1:59 for the next three digits of pi. I think I might have some chicken pot pie for dinner with apple pie for dessert on that day. This year Daylight Saving Time happens to start on the 14th. Don't forget to spring ahead!

The other unofficial holiday in March is special to marching bands and parade units. March 4, said as march forth, has caught the attention of many groups that march forth to do their performances in parades or in a stadium. Although parades are still on hold, perhaps our Shrine units can use the day to contemplate a time when parades will begin once more. Some parade organizers are trying a reverse parade, where the units and floats are stationary and the spectators drive past. If this proves successful, our Shrine units can participate, although I imagine the Tin Lizzies might have a little difficulty holding still. Joining in reverse parades might be a good opportunity to revive the Clown unit, and even expand the Clowns to include other costumed performers. I know that some of the Nobles and Ladies do costumed activities like Renaissance Fairs, Civil War Re-enactments and Steampunk conventions. Including these costumed folks in with traditional clowns can spark wider interest in the unit, greater visibility for our Shrine and more participation in parades and Hospital events. I think something to seriously consider.
